
Congratulations to **Tom Hester** for being selected Southeastern's Associate of the Month for November of 1992!

### "Congratulations! You have been named..."

It was decided at a recent "Vital Signs" staff meeting to remind everyone of the eligibility requirements for the Associate of the Month Award. Here are the requirements as listed in the Southeastern Associate Handbook-

Eligibility for Associate of the Year Award.



### **Customer Spotlight:** Raleigh Community Hospital

Raleigh Community Hospital began in 1914, when a general surgeon, Dr. Harold Glascock, and an osteopath, Dr. A. R. Tucker, opened a hospital across the street from what is now Peace College. It was called Mary Elizabeth. It contained 15 rooms, including an operating room, anesthesia area, dining room, reception room, and a superintendents office.

It was in the late 60's that the physicians of Mary Elizabeth saw that they needed to expand the hospital to improve equipment and the facility. Just prior to the grand opening, there was a decision made to change the name of the hospital from Mary Elizabeth to the current name of Raleigh Community Hospital.

On June 4, 1978, Raleigh Community Hospital held its dedication and grand opening ceremonies. There were 57 employees at Mary Elizabeth in 1978. Forty-two of the employees helped open Raleigh Community. There were only 16 physicians on the medical staff compared to the more than 460 employed today.

The hospital contin-

ues to grow to meet the needs of the changing community. The word "Community" in its name is symbolic of its efforts to improve the health and lifestyle of its fellow citizens. Since Raleigh Community is a medium-sized hospital, their healthcare specialists are able to work together in a productive, personal and caring style.

Raleigh Community Hospital developed a logo and philosophy statement that they believe will continue the tradition that was established at Mary Elizabeth Hospital 75 years ago.

Healthcare with a human face- that's what Raleigh Community Hospital is all about. They treat you like a person before they treat you like a patient.

Southeastern is proud and honored to serve such a needed member of our healthcare industry!
