NEWSFLASH!

...this special news report just in from Southeastern news central...

Numerous reports of missing persons are being made at Southeastern on Forsythe Street. Some individuals have been reported missing and in other cases, entire departments have mysteriously disappeared.

each other as a team and will provide a more efficient way of dealing with our customers' needs.

If you are still a little confused about the moves, here is a general breakdown of where the new divisions are located, or will be located, in the near future:

The Long Term Care Division is now located where the Home Care Store was.

The Hospital Division is now located in the new offices built in the warehouse.

The Physician Division will relocate to where Hospital Account Services and Purchasing offices were. The construction is now underway.

Marketing will acquire more breathing space when they occupy the area the Physician Team now has.

A file room will be built and files in the office behind what is now the Credit Department will be moved to their new home. The External Systems Team will then move where the files were.

The Computer Room will become an equipment room and those folks will be transferred to the office that is now the Credit Department.

As you can see, there are many exciting changes that have taken place. There are more changes being made and others that may not have been mentioned as of yet. So remember to stay tuned to your local station for further important details on the expansion of our Company.



Wayne, it was a disaster.



When I retired from the Air Force's Medical Service in 1968, **Bud Faircloth** hired me for the Shipping and Receiving Department of the SEHS Warehouse. This was a large department consisting of one person, "me". Over the years, I moved on to Stock Records, then Purchasing, then Sales, Bids, Help Desk, and now Marketing.


It has been a real privilege to see the astonishing pace of growth and evolvement of SEHS during the past quarter century. The small glass display case, that I sold items from, evolved into a modern, free standing Home Care Store. The small bag of tools and ohmmeter, that I used to repair items with, evolved into a technically equipped, three person repair team. About the only thing that has not changed, is my function as company EMT. The cuts and scrapes, sprains and splinters, upset tummies, other ailments and minor "booboos" have remained the same.

Often, when I returned from a sales call, Mr. Manning, Sr., would say to me, "Art, did you make us a sale? If not, did you make us a friend?" I took this to be a part of his business philosophy.

For a number of years, Mr. Manning encouraged me to lecture in the County Schools' Health Occupations Classes. During these classes, I tried to convey that philosophy of "customer relations" to the tudents.

Some of my most memorable days at SEHS are:

- The day Mr. Manning bought the first truck,
- The day Cliff Christianson created the slant-back truck,
- the day Bob Hartley arrived as a salesman,
- the day of the great Abbot IV recall and being on the road with Ray Manning, Jr. We delivered emergency IV fluids to hospitals around the clock and did IV in-services in the hallways;
- the day teenager Janice Nettles came to work, and the day Jean Jackson came to work.



Mr. Manning would say to me, "Art did you make us a sale? If not, did you make us a friend?"


I greatly value my long association with the Manning family, Mr. Faircloth, and the many wonderful people I work with here at SEHS. - Art Capps

Left: Art Capps, one of the reasons for Southeastern's success. Here Art is pictured doing his favorite thing...standing in his corner taking care of his customers' needs.




REMINDER!

Offices will re-open at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, September 7th...


